The Event is Located on Private Land in Lancaster, CA
The entrance to the dirt access road to the event is located at the curved intersection of 160th W and Lancaster Rd.

- 1. If traveling from the South as you reach the address above the road will curve to the right. After this curve follow the road for 0.3 miles. (GO TO STEP 3)
- 2. If traveling from the North 0.5 miles before reaching the address above you will see a cone to your left before the road turns right. Enter the dirt road 160th W (GO TO STEP 4)
- 3. In 0.3 miles as the road curves left you will see an orange construction cone to your right marking the entrance into the dirt access road. (This dirt road is 160th W)
- 4. Turn right and enter the dirt access road (160th W) and continue straight on this road for 0.6 miles then turn right. (Yellow tape labeled "restricted area" will be blocking all turns left)
- 5. After making the right, follow the road for 0.5 miles. At .05 miles the road will curve to the left.
- 6. Follow the road for 0.4 miles staying to your right. (small tires will be blocking any access to the left) You will come to a fork in the road. Turn right at the Fork.
- 7. Continue for .04 miles and check in with the staff at the GVT welcome canopy.
