



<b>Sparkling Wines</b>	<b>Hesketh 'The Proposition' Sparkling Rosé (Adelaide Hills, S. Australia)</b> a blend of oaked and unoaked Chardonnay, with Semillon added for some sweetness and a small amount of Shiraz creating its unique color; a very compelling combination of sweet and tart flavors	<b>10</b>	<b>43</b>
	<b>Cristalino Brut Cava (Penedes, Italy)</b> made from the traditional Cava grapes - Parellada, Macabeo, and Xarel-lo; clean citrus on the nose, depth and complexity, dry with a long, pleasant finish	<b>7.5</b>	<b>22</b>
<b>Rosés</b>	<b>Dostert Rosay 2009 (Mosel, Germany)</b> a pale rosé wine with a high acidic structure from Roter Elbling grapes, a mutated, lighter version of Elbling grapes, brought to Germany by the Romans	<b>9.5</b>	<b>35</b>
	<b>J&amp;J Cellars Tempranillo Rosé (Paso Robles, California)</b> a youthful and refreshing rosé; aromas and flavors of strawberry and melon, balanced acidity and sweetness, with a light touch of tannin	<b>7</b>	<b>26</b>
	<b>Shvo Vineyards 2009 Rosé (Upper Galilee, Northern Israel)</b> made entirely from Barbera grapes allowed minimal contact with the skins, fermented with only native yeasts; light- to medium-bodied, a smooth, ripe and generous, remarkably well balanced with appealing plum, cherry, berry and raspberry notes and soft tannins, all leading to a long and supple finish	<b>11.5</b>	<b>41</b>
<b>Whites</b>	<b>Domaine Phillippe Gouley 2008 Petite Chablis (Burgundy, France)</b> hints of green apple and taste of green fruit, oak, and honey; well balanced, with a nice minerality and smooth, satisfying finish	<b>9</b>	<b>33</b>
	<b>Malat 2009 Göttweiger Berg Riesling (Kremstal, Austria)</b> a 100% Riesling from one of Austria's leading wine families; boasts strong notes of citrus while still very dry on the finish, with flavors of fruit and spice; pairs especially well with seafood and spicy foods	<b>11</b>	<b>39</b>
	<b>Mud House 2010 Sauvignon Blanc (Marlborough, New Zealand)</b> a prototypical New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc: clean and crisp acidity; notes of gooseberry, passion fruit, lime leaf, and grass; silky, medium-bodied texture with a lingering finish	<b>7.5</b>	<b>24</b>
	<b>Pelter 2010 Sauvignon Blanc (Golan Heights, Northern Israel)</b> medium-bodied, with notes of citrus and tropical fruits, & stony; crisp acidity makes this wine simultaneously complex and easy to drink	<b>9.5</b>	<b>36</b>
<b>Reds</b>	<b>Beronia 2001 Gran Reserva (La Rioja, Spain)</b> a bright, almost decadent Tempranillo Rioja, with alluring aromas of candied cherry, plum and cedar, with vanilla and clove notes on a long, sweet finish	<b>14</b>	<b>56</b>
	<b>Forager 2009 Pinot Noir (Sonoma, California)</b> aged in new French oak, perfectly combining New World Californian and Old World Burgundian styles, with a subtle background flavor that doesn't overpower the blend of cherries, violet, earth and spices	<b>12</b>	<b>43</b>
	<b>Flam 2007 Cabernet Reserve (Judean Hills, Central Israel)</b> full-bodied, gently tannic and concentrated with notes of spicy wood, black cherry, blackberry and currant, opens to reveal hints of red berries and brown spices, and a long, broad and elegant finish	<b>14</b>	<b>59</b>
	<b>Jenny &amp; Francois 'From the Tank' Vin Rouge Cotes du Rhone (Estézargues, France)</b> a classic 'everyday wine' combining Grenache, Syrah, and Carignan grapes produced by the only co-op in France making natural wines (no commercial yeasts, no enzymes, no filtering, minimal sulfur before bottling); medium-bodied, ripe berries harvested at their peak with a firm, underlying earthiness; comes in a 'light carbon footprint' box containing the equivalent of four (!) 750ml bottles (the perfect wine for your table if you've come with a big party to Swill Automatic)	<b>10</b>	<b>86</b>
	<b>Hesketh 'Usual Suspects' Shiraz (McClaren Vale, Australia)</b> vibrant fruit, complexity, elegance, and balance; a 'thinking' shiraz that evolves and reveals itself as you progress through the glass and bottle	<b>9</b>	<b>34</b>
	<b>Michaud 2004 Syrah (Monterey, California)</b> dark, supple and substantial in weight on the palate; moderate, silky tannins surround flavors of black cherry and blackberry, hints of black pepper; pleasant mineral-earthiness and restrained oak complement and extend the harmonious finish.	<b>9.5</b>	<b>37</b>
	<b>Pelter 2009 Trio (Golan Heights, Northern Israel)</b> a blend of 70% Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% each of Merlot and Cabernet Franc; aged 14 months in French oak; aromas of earth and vanilla; notes berries and cassis, roasted herbs and earthy minerals. Tannins and fruits rise nicely on a long, satisfying finish	<b>12</b>	<b>43</b>
	<b>Tulip 2007 Syrah Reserve (Kfar Tikva, Northern Israel)</b> oak-aged for 16 months, dark and full-bodied, with spicy wood and softly gripping tannins in fine balance and integrating nicely with rich blackberry, wild berry and black cherry fruit, and a sumptuous, deep, and long finish	<b>13.5</b>	<b>56</b>
<b>Dessert Wines</b>	<b>3 Puttonyos Tokaji Aszú (Várhegy, Hungary)</b> an approachable and satisfying dessert wine with all of the characteristic flavors or a quality Tokaji Aszú; also great as a pre-dining apéritif	<b>10</b>	
	<b>Rietvallei 2008 Muscadel (Robertson, South Africa)</b> red-gold hue sparkles in the glass; the intense Muscat flavor is first strong on the nose, then floods the palate with a complex, raisiny sweetness	<b>10</b>	



<b>Sparkling Wines</b>	<b>Bele Casel Prosecco Superiore (Caerano S. Marco, Italy)</b> from a small Italian "artisan" producer ; fresh, rich aromas of apple & pear; pronounced citrus and floral notes with good acidity; dry yet with a soft mouth feel	<b>38</b>
-almost gone-	<b>Latitude 50 N Sekt Trocken Rosé (Rheingau, Germany)</b> a blend of portugeiser, dornfelder and pinot noir grapes in a sparkling rosé; super creamy mousse, pretty strawberry fruit, lemon zest and a pleasant finish	<b>32</b>
-almost gone-	<b>Philippe Bornard 'Tant Mieux' Rosé Pétillant Naturel (Arbois Pupillin, France)</b> in French, 'Tant Mieux' means 'so much the better,' and not an exaggeration to call this 'crazy good'; a luscious, completely satisfying biodynamic sparkling rosé from the Jura region and one of France's most exciting and highly regarded natural winemakers	<b>47</b>
-new arrival-	<b>Drei Dona Rosenere Lambrusco (Emiglia-Romano, Italy)</b> brightened by a healthy dose of residual sugar, notes of fresh-picked raspberry, strawberry and maraschino cherry, and a nice fizz; a perfect bottle for a warm summer evening	<b>28</b>
<b>Rosés</b>	<b>Ceago 2010 Syrah Rosé (Clear Lake, California)</b> delicate, complex aromas of strawberry, rose petal, and a touch of cotton candy; generous palate, round & soft yet brisk and firm with crisp acidity and a silky richness	<b>38</b>
	<b>The Peñascal Estate 2006 Tempranillo Rosé (Castilla y Leon, Spain)</b> a spicy blend of mostly Tempranillo with a small amount of Shiraz to add complexity; aged in American oak, which brings out an earthiness, with rich flavors of tart black cherry and tobacco though still with an extremely smooth finish	<b>31</b>
<b>Whites</b>	<b>Bedrock Wine Company 2009 "Brousseau Vineyard" Chalone Chardonnay (Sonoma, California)</b> a small production (50 cases made), 'atypical' Chardonnay from 30-year-old Wente clone vines; bright and balanced, with a pleasant minerality	<b>38</b>
	<b>Brüder Dr. Becker 2009 Scheurebe (Rheinhessen, Germany)</b> from one of Germany's most innovative natural winemakers; an aromatic combination of orchard fruits with exotic hints of passion fruit and black currants	<b>36</b>
-almost gone-	<b>Cono Sur Bicycle 2009 Viognier (Colchagua Valley, Chile)</b> sweet, fruity notes of apricots, citrus and peaches combine with pleasant oak aromas; a full and savory, classic Chilean white wine	<b>29</b>
	<b>Donkey &amp; Goat 2010 Grenache Blanc (Berkeley, California)</b> from a NorCal husband-and-wife artisanal winemaking team applying the latest in natural winemaking practices; rich and full-bodied, extremely well balanced and satisfying, with food or on its own, with a nose of honeysuckle and flavors of pears and citrus	<b>43</b>
	<b>Estampa 2006 Assemblage Reserve (Casablanca Valley, Chile)</b> a classic Chilean blend of Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, and Viognier; notes of citrus and other fruits, as well as hints of tart passion fruit and celery	<b>29</b>
-new arrival-	<b>Foxen Tinaquiac Vineyard 2009 Chardonnay (Santa Maria, California)</b> a classic California Chardonnay, with notes of pineapple, yellow apricot, crème brûlée, honey and buttered toast balanced with crisp acidity	<b>39</b>
	<b>San Telmo Esencia 2009 Torrontes (Mendoza, Argentina)</b> crisp fruit, floral accents, balanced acidity; the distinctive Torrontés grape is unique to Argentina and is the country's most popular white varietal	<b>28</b>
-new arrival-	<b>Torre Gaia 2009 Sannio Falanghina (Dugenta, Italy)</b> among the oldest cultivated grapes in Europe, this Falanghina is a classic example, with balanced acidity, hints of apple, subtle spices, a nice minerality, and a pleasant vanilla finish	<b>27</b>
<b>Reds</b>	<b>Bura-Mrgudić - Dingač 2006 Plavac Mali (Potomje Pelješac, Croatia)</b> simply a great Croatian wine; less than 200 cases produced, from the famed Dingač vineyard in South Dalmatia, farmed organically and by hand; intense black fruit aromas, notes of pine and hay; ample acidity and tannin support the lush, creamy black fruit of figs and blueberry jam	<b>78</b>
-almost gone-	<b>Chateau du Champ Des Treilles 2006 Bordeaux (St. Foy Bordeaux, France)</b> good balance of fruit and gravelly soil, excellent acidity and structure; a medium intensity on the nose, boisenberry, medium-bodied with moderate tannins and a light, refreshing finish of cranberries, tart red cherries, and only a hint of wood	<b>39</b>
-new arrival-	<b>Cloudy Bay 2007 Pinot Noir (Marlborough, New Zealand)</b> delicate cherry and vanilla shadings complemented by a nice, spicy complexity; round and plump on the palate, marked by crisp acids and silky tannins on the finish	<b>44</b>
	<b>Domaine de L'Ausseil P'tit Piaf 2008 Vin de Pays (Latour, France)</b> a hand-picked Merlot with all the hallmarks of the varietal (red fruit, fresh nose, round and supple mouthfeel) plus terroir-driven notes of bell pepper and blackcurrant; freshly perfumed and light at the close	<b>37</b>
	<b>Domino de la Peseta 2001 Crianza (Alicanté, Spain)</b> bright, rich, and concentrated in flavor as a result of the scarce rainfall of its terroir on the northern face of the Sierra de Salinas	<b>42</b>
	<b>Easton 2002 Cabernet Sauvignon (Shenandoah Valley, California)</b> lush fruit and rich, intricate tannins frame well-ripened cassis and blackberry flavors; dry and balanced, with a hint of rusticity	<b>43</b>
-new arrival-	<b>Equinox 2009 Crozes-Hermitage (Rhône, France)</b> notes of roasted oak and fresh herbs, layers of lush red fruit underpinned by notes of herbs, spice and fresh forest aromas; unlike California Syrahs, which can be overly jammy, this Crozes-Hermitage is rustic and gritty, yet still smooth and silky	<b>37</b>
-new arrival-	<b>Hocus Pocus 2009 Pinot Noir (Lompoc, California)</b> made in a lighter style, from the cooler Napa side of the Carneros; light- to medium-bodied and dry, with a silky texture and flavors of cherries, exotic dusty spices and sandalwood	<b>46</b>
	<b>La Follette 2009 Pinot Noir (Sonoma, California)</b> fermented with indigenous yeast; nose of lush, fresh fruit, expressive aromatics marked by sarsaparilla and sweet floral notes, full body, supple tannins, juicy pomegranate on late palate	<b>46</b>
	<b>Mouressipe 'Cácouis' 2009 Vin de France (Languedoc, France)</b> a 'wild and gamy' 50/50 blend of syrah and Grenache with explosive floral nuances and earthy meaty notes that evoke charcuterie and pâté	<b>42</b>
-almost gone-	<b>Vietti 2007 Nebbiolo Perbacco (Castiglione Falletto, Italy)</b> generous fruit which offers intensity while still retaining an essentially mid-weight style; round, soft tannins contribute to a long and refined finish	<b>44</b>
